Greenwood has a small mall with Belk and JC Penney as the base stores. Michaels, TJ Maxx, Bath & Body, Kay Jewelers, The Children's Place, Foot Locker and rue 21 have been long term tenants. Outside eateries include, Chick-fil-A, Panera, Honey Baked Ham, Firehouse Subs and Starbucks and Subway.

Greenwood has Lowe's, Harbor Freight, Hobby Lobby, Big Lots, 2 Walmart's, Ollie's, Auto Zone, Kohl's, Ross Dress for Less, small Sear's appliance store, Firestone Tire and Big Mac's Tire Store and long standing Parker Furniture and pet shops, Pet Smart and many local groomers.

Many local shops thrive in Greenwood, including the multiple consignment stores, local jeweler, distinctive clothiers for men, women and children's boutiques and our own Captain Crusty's Seafood and Fresh Market for catch of the day straight from the coast of SC.

Farmer's market Uptown and at the Civic Center hosts multiple local farmers and artists most weekends. Grocery shopping at multiple groceries including, Aldi's, BiLo, Corley's Market, Food Lion, Lidl's, the Mennonite Pantry, Publix, and Save-a-Lot.

Many local artists sell products and host classes for pottery, painting, gardening, wood craft, baskets and jewelry making.

Neighboring Abbeville, Clinton, Laurens, Newberry and Ninety Six all offer unique shopping experiences and offer a multitude of antique shops.

Anderson, Greenville, and Spartanburg are all within an hour's driving distance and offer the larger malls, and superstores, including, Costco's, Sam's, Best Buy, Toys-R-Us, Babies-R-Us, Whole Foods, Target, Trader Joe's, Dillard's, Macy's and another entire array of restaurants.
